CHAIRPERSON'S MESSAGE



This has been a rewarding year for CBDCs and small businesses in Newfoundland and Labrador. CBDCs have been actively working to help people start and expand businesses and have accomplished this by offering small business loans, training programs, and advisory services to entrepreneurs in rural communities.

The fifteen CBDCs assisted 362 businesses, of which 120 were new start-ups. Over the last five years, with

the assistance of funds provided by a CBDC, there have been 599 new businesses created. This demonstrates positive entrepreneurial resilience for the growth and support of our communities. When CBDCs support small businesses, these small businesses grow the local economy, diversify our communities and create jobs. During the 2018-19 year, the CBDC assisted businesses created and maintained more than 1000 jobs.

All of this development stems from lending the small businesses \$21.4 million. The Boards of Directors of the fifteen CBDCs are comprised of more than 100 community leaders, all of whom are passionate about supporting the economic diversification of our province and are skilled in assessing business opportunities.

As Chairperson of the NL Association of CBDCs, I would like to acknowledge the Board Members and staff of the 15 CBDCs for their continued commitment this past year. I would also like to thank the Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency for their ongoing support. Lastly, I want to say congratulations to all of the entrepreneurs of the province, as their small businesses continue to make a big impact.







CBDC Avalon West promotes small business development within the 42 communities that comprise the Cape Shore, Isthmus, St. Mary's Bay North and Placentia regions of the Province. The Corporation has eight dedicated volunteer directors who meet on a monthly basis. To ensure geographical equity, each of the four sub-regions is represented by two directors each.

The region is extensively rural in nature and historically has been heavily reliant upon the fishing industry. The industrial developments ongoing at Long Harbour and Argentia have resulted in direct employment for residents in the construction, mining and oil and gas sectors. Spin-off effects from these developments are being felt in the accommodations, service and retail sectors.

CBDC Avalon West continues to build on its relationships with its partners within the economic development and business financing sectors in order to grow and enhance the local business community. The opportunities for local businesses are great and CBDC Avalon West is well positioned to provide assistance.



BURIN PENINSULA

CBDC Burin Peninsula was established in 1991, and represents some 33 small towns and communities on the Burin Peninsula, with a combined population of approximately 23,000 people. Governed by a volunteer board of directors, the mandate of the CBDC is to create jobs through small business development.

The local Burin Peninsula economy is still driven to a large degree by the fishery with processing facilities in St. Lawrence, Fortune and Grand Bank. Local harvesters participate in a wide range of fisheries including cod, crab, whelk, clams, lobster, sea cucumber and scallop. An inflatable air shelters manufacturing plant in Grand Bank creates significant employment opportunities in the local area with products being shipped all over the world. The region in close proximity to the French Islands of St. Pierre and Miquelon attracts approximately 15,000 people annually who access the French Islands through the Burin Peninsula. The newly opened fluorspar mining operation in St. Lawrence and the start of construction of a new state of the art salmon hatchery in Marystown is a boost to the local economy expecting to generate significant economic benefits for years to come. Work continues at the Cow Head Offshore Fabrication Facility in Marystown while negotiations are ongoing with regard to the sale of the Marystown Shipyard facility, that would turn the region into an aquaculture hub for the province. In addition, plans are well underway for the development of a medical cannabis grow out operation in the region.

The CBDC small business financing programs and services are a good fit for small business operations throughout the region, and the Corporation has already seen the benefits from the economic upturn in the region through increased lending activity associated with spin off opportunities from bigger business projects.



Cabot Community Business Development Corporation (CCBDC) is one of fifteen organizations established to service specific rural communities throughout Newfoundland and Labrador.

Our Board services all communities located in the Northeast Avalon region between Marysvale in the west and Logy Bay in the east, and includes Bell Island. Of the CBDCs across NL, CBDC Cabot is the smallest geographically but is the greatest in terms of population density, with approximately 76,000 residents across the 17 communities served. We provide support to clients and the community at large through various loan products and programs including the Self-Employment Assistance Program.

A major focus of Cabot CBDC in 2018 was the enhancement of accountability to stakeholders including clients, government and the community at large. This was largely accomplished through the holding of a public annual general meeting to present a financial and operating report covering the latest fiscal year. CBDC Cabot actively partnered with other community-minded agencies in improving program outreach and furthering various economic development related initiatives.



CBDC Celtic is located in Ferryland and has been providing business support since 1991 to the communities of Petty Harbour/Maddox Cove to Mall Bay, St. Mary's. This region has a rich cultural heritage and a growing tourism industry with significant anchor tourist attractions. The 32 communities served stretch out over 205 kilometers with a population of 13,698. The region encompasses a rural and growing urban area. We have a variety of industries that include the fishery, tourism, manufacturing, and retail/wholesale. CBDC Celtic has supported businesses in all these sectors as well as construction, agriculture and social enterprise.

Since inception, CBDC Celtic has disbursed over \$14.6 M to businesses in our region. As of March 31, 2019, loans outstanding totaled: \$5,744,313.59. In addition to lending, advice and support to businesses, we also provide training opportunities, administer the Self-Employment Assistance Program, Consultant Advisory Services and the Youth Ventures Program.

CBDC Celtic is governed by a volunteer board of directors and clients are served by professional staff whom all reside in the geographical region. Annual general meetings are held in October and rotated in communities throughout the region.



CBDC Central represents approximately 25 towns in and around Central Newfoundland's Exploits Valley. The region, with a population of 26,190, spans from Buchans in the west to Norris Arm in the East, north to Fortune Harbour and Leading Tickles, including the towns of Badger, Bishop's Falls, and Botwood.

The Corporation has been operating successfully for over 35 years, this can be attributed to being governed by a strong volunteer Board of Directors, and a resilient, diversified economy in the area. Developed in large part as a result of a paper making industry in the early 1900's, the region has expanded into a number of new and traditional industries and sectors including the health care economy, mining, fishing and aquaculture, retail, technology, agriculture, constructions, forestry, and tourism – with new projects on the horizon.

Most recently, the region has been working to develop its tourism product and offers such activities as river rafting the exploits river, iceberg tours, sea kayaking tours, groomed snowmobiling, world class salmon fishing, and now the development of Grand Falls House and Harmsworth property. This balanced approach and changing environment has allowed the Corporation to continually provide access to financing, business counselling, and training opportunities for small business and entrepreneurs.



CBDC Eastern Initiatives is located in the town of Clarenville and is responsible for servicing a population of approximately 32,000 people residing in 94 communities. The area serviced includes the Bonavista Peninsula and all communities located between Arnold's Cove – Swift Current – Port Blandford. The Corporation operates under the control of a local volunteer Board of Directors comprised of seven members who are assisted by our professional staff. As of March 31, 2019, the Corporation had \$5,120,468 invested in the community through its core lending program.

CBDC Eastern Initiatives was established 27 years ago to deliver financial, advisory and technical services to new, existing and expanding businesses in our region. We offer a variety of loan products, business counselling and access to training. Additionally, we partner with the Department of Advanced Education, Skills and Labour to help new entrepreneurs access the Self-Employment Benefit Program.

The region we serve has a very diverse economic base. Clarenville acts as a service centre for the surrounding communities due to its strategic location. Come By Chance is the location of the only oil refinery in the Province. Arnold's Cove has a strong fishing industry and a state of the art ground fish processing facility. As well, the Bonavista Peninsula is one of the premier tourism destinations in the Province.
