As Chair of the Board of Directors, it gives me great pleasure to present the annual report for the year ending March 31st, 2023.

This year marks West Prince Ventures Limited's 41st year for delivering Community Business Economic development in Western PEI. Our region has a strong economy derived from agriculture, fishing, aquaculture, and tourism. Supporting these and other industries over the years has contributed to creating and maintaining 4394 jobs with a total value of loans advanced of \$38,630,642. The success of the corporation comes from the dedication of many committed volunteers, professional staff and hardworking entrepreneurs who have contributed to the economic growth of Western, PEI.

This past year has brought many successes and new challenges. Although we are moving out of the pandemic, the economic impact of COVD-19 has caused significant increases in inflation rates, which has resulted in increased Bank of Canada interest rates. Our organization has worked very diligently with our business community to ensure they have the resources to see their businesses through these challenging times. We continue to support our clients through programs such as the Regional Relief & Recovery Fund, Emergency Working Capital Loan Program, Tourism Activation Grant, and the Tourism Seasonal Extension Program. We continue to support business endeavors through our loan products which provide financing up to \$300,000, Business Management Training & Entrepreneurial workshops, Consultant Advisory Services. We take great pride in hosting the Rural Action Centre in Alberton and the partnerships this brings to the region. West Prince Ventures Limited also developed and delivers the PEI Community Navigator Program. This program ensures our rural communities have the support they need to welcome and sustain new residents for population growth in rural PEI. We have had great success within the program and continue to grow in demand for settlement services in the rural regions of PEI.

I would like to thank Marilyn Murphy of the Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency (ACOA) for her continued support through the Community Futures Program. ACOA has demonstrated ongoing confidence in the CBDCs, and we are very pleased to administer many important initiatives on the agency's behalf.

I also want to thank Basil Ryan, Chief Operating Officer of the Atlantic Association of Community Business Development Corporations (CBDC), and the Atlantic staff for their dedication in strengthening the CBDC network.

In closing, I would like to extend my sincere appreciation to my fellow board members and to the staff for their dedication & hard work this past year. I look forward to working with you all in the coming year for continued success and economic growth in Rural PEI.

A Message from Executive Director Maxine Rennie

It is with immense pride and gratitude I bring forward the exceptional work accomplished by our team here at CBDC Western, PEI for the year 2022-23.

CBDC West Prince Ventures Limited is federally funded through the Community Futures Program, delivering business financing, as well as other business support services through training and counselling, Human Resource support and community development to Western PEI since 1981. Our business development programs had great growth this past year. Under our lending division we had 55 requests for financing that were presented to the Board of Directors of which 52 were approved with a value of assistance of \$4.810.410. This is over a 20% increase from last year. We promote our Entrepreneurial Training Fund to assist clients in strengthening their business management skills. This year we advanced \$26,377 to support 87 clients. We have a current two-year contract to deliver the Consulting Advisory Services Program. This year we assisted 5 businesses with a value of assistance of \$21,000.

As we are moving out of the Covid 19 pandemic we continue to support our business community with the challenges this has brought in economic impacts of increased inflation rates and the bank of Canada's interest rates. The RRRF/RRRFX programs brought in over the pandemic for support has been extended to December 31, 2023, and we will be working with our clients to ensure they are assisted in the repayment process.

PEI CBDCs partnered with Tourism PEI to deliver the Tourism Activation Grant. This program provided tourism businesses with a non-repayable grant toward expenses to assist with capital and/or maintenance costs associated in opening for the 2021 & 2022 season. We are currently delivering the Tourism Seasonal Extension Program to assist tourism operators in growing their business and extending beyond their current closing dates. We are very thankful for the partnership with Tourism PEI and look forward to continued programs in the future.

We developed and delivered the PEI Community Navigator program to support new residents and our communities in aiding population growth of rural PEI. The PEI Community Navigator program has seen great success. The growth of the program has generated over 150% increase in Client Interactions and 66% increase in Employer Interactions this year. With this increase in demand, we are working to add additional resources to the program to ensure continued support to grow the population of rural PEI. Our organization hosts the Rural Action Centre for Western PEI to support our business and community groups by housing multiple federal, provincial and nongovernment agencies. The Rural Action Center is now a staple for business support in our rural communities and our government partners of Rural Development, ACOA and IPEI are to be commended for their support. This year we welcomed Develop West Prince to our centre, and we will continue to pursue additional partnerships to add to our compliment of services.

Our annual report highlights the many programs we offer to assist in the growth of the economy of Western, PEI. This success comes from many individuals and the great partnerships we have with government, which include the following:



:0VID-19 Relief Programs Regional Relief & Recovery Fund & Extension Program

In January, 2023 an extension for the loan forgiveness was granted to December 31. 2023.

Repaying the balance of the RRRF & RRRFX loan on or before December 31, 2023 will result in the forgiveness of 25% (up to \$10,000) for the initial \$40,000 and 50% (up to \$10,000) for the supplemental \$20,000. There is no interest accrued until January 1, 2024, with outstanding balances to be paid on or before December 31, 2025.

Tourism Activation Grant

The Tourism Activation Grant (TAG) was a joint partnership between Tourism PEI and CBDCs in Western, Central & Eastern PEI. The program provided tourism businesses with a non-repayable grant towards eligible expenses to assist with capital and/or maintenance costs associated with opening for the 2022 season.

Applicant eligibility included a minimum 30% decrease in tourism related revenues for 2021 compared to 2019. Applicants had to have at least \$25,000 in gross revenues for 2019. The maximum grant was \$50,000.



Tourism Seasonal Extension Program

The Tourism Seasonal Extension Program is a joint partnership between Tourism PEI and CBDCs in Western, Central & Eastern PEI and was launched beginning in January, 2023. The program is intended to support capital investments that will help tourism businesses remain open on a multi-season basis.

The maximum amount of eligible capital expenses will be calculated at 4% of 2019 gross revenues. Eligible expenses include new product offerings, maintenance required to open on a multi-season basis, new equipment, insulation of buildings, indoor/outdoor heaters, outdoor dining domes and other infrastructure projects. The maximum grant is \$50,000.





Consultant Advisory Services Program



The Consultant Advisory Services Program can provide small and medium sized businesses with financial assistance (up to 75% of eligible costs) to engage consultants to assist with business opportunities and challenges.

CBDC Western PEI is administering the contract supported by Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency (ACOA) and Innovation PEI to offer the CASP to the three PEI CBDCs from April 1, 2022 to March 31, 2024.

Entrepreneurial Training Fund



The Entrepreneurial Training Fund (ETF) can provide financial assistance relating to costs associated with business skills training in special areas such as market development, bookkeeping, feasibility studies, and business analysis. (90% up to a maximum of \$2,000.00)

Training can be in the form of, but not limited to, one-on-one consultation, classroom style courses, seminars and conferences.

CBDC West Prince Ventures in partnership with Rural Action Centre - Alberton hosted Corina Walsh CEO. Certified Coach. Author & Speaker of Shift People Development Inc to deliver a workshop on Attracting, Engaging & Retaining Employees. Comedian Patrick Ledwell was the Emcee.

Corina gave key takeaway information to assist employers with strategies to recruit and attract new employees, orientation and onboarding techniques, employee engagement and retention strategies, including how to motivate and engage current employees, understanding the employee journey, and what is required from business owners and managers to boost engagement and satisfaction along that journey.

The workshop was followed by a panel discussion including Rural Western PEI employer, Harvey Stewart of Trout River Industries in Coleman, Scott Smith, Western PEI Community Navigator, Rural Central PEI employer. Thane Smallwood of PEI Bag Company in Bedegue, and Peggy Miles, Central PEI Community Navigator.

Employers shared experiences and challenges with remaining competitive in the labor force; as well as success stories for integrating newcomer employees, increasing employee's overall satisfaction, and expanding their workforces. PEI Community Navigators shared about the importance of working together to build welcoming workplaces and welcoming communities for all, and how its success leads to stronger morale amongst employees/community members, overall successes, better integration, and increased retention of employees/community members.

Approximately 20 employers took part in this informative workshop.





Moung Millionaires Program

Providing youth aged 9-16 the opportunity to explore entrepreneurship

CBDC Western PEI, in partnership with Central Development Corporation, was pleased to administer the Young Millionaires Program to young entrepreneurs in the Western region for 2022.

The Program Coordinator was Kailee Skerry. Kailee is currently studying Business at the University of PEI. Her friendly personality and enthusiastic attitude made her a great fit to Coordinate this Program to young entrepreneurs over the summer.

Kailee visited the Elementary & Intermediate schools in the area to promote the program. The program had a total of 33 participants take part.

Before receiving their grant money to start their business, participants were required to take part in workshops that taught them the fundamentals of operating a business. This information would allow them to start and operate their businesses through the summer.

CBDC Western PEI was grateful for the partnership with Mill River Resort, who graciously allowed participants to use their space for workshops.

Over the summer, Kailee was able to check in with participants at several vending opportunities. Some of the events participants took part in included the PEI Potato Blossom Festival, the Prince County Exhibition, and other smaller markets in the area. These vending opportunities gave participants a chance to showcase and sell their products.

To wrap up the summer Program, participants and their families took part in a Celebration Night at Mill River Resort. Special guests in attendance included MP Bobby Morrissey, MLA Hon. Ernie Hudson, MLA Trish Altass & MLA Robert Henderson. Participants gave a short speech of their experiences in the program and what they accomplished in the Program.





Rural Action Centre -Client Information Officer's Report

I am pleased to present this Activity Report for Rural Action Centre - Alberton (RAC) as of March 31, 2023.

This past year has marked our 12th year of operation and has recognized many accomplishments. As of July 2022, we were pleased COVID – 19 protocols were lifted thus allowing our program delivery to return to near normal practice. RAC Alberton continues to offer a mixed complement of in-person and on-line workshops and sessions. Our Boardroom and Meeting Rooms are complete with up-to-date technology to accommodate business and community meetings. We also appreciate being able to utilize Mill River Resort and Northport Community Centre when additional space for engagement is required.

RAC Alberton partnered with CBDC Western PEI to promote and engage in initiatives such as CBDC Day, The Young Millionaires Program, and Small Business Week; in addition to Planning for Perfection – Writing a Business Plan, HR Attracting, Engaging & Retaining Employees, Microsoft Excel Training and Payroll Plus. RAC Alberton continues to partner with C & M Inc/PEI First Aid Services to deliver Red Cross Emergency First Aid & CPR/AED Training to over 125 people from Western PEI and across the Island each year.

The three PEI Rural Action Centres also shared in the delivery of programs such as Nuts and Bolts of Business Success, IPEI Ignition Fund, eForcePEI, Writing a Proposal, and Risk Management for Non-Profits, to name a few. Two recent initiatives include RAC Storytelling Campaign and RAC Good News Campaign – both of which feature clients via social media platforms to assist in our RAC brand awareness. In keeping with our on-going strategy, RAC Alberton continues to provide an Information Folder, a resource which provides brochures representing each Partner and the programs and services they offer. This resource, complete with a RAC Partner Photo Page, is also available electronically and is included as part of any responses to inquiries via email. The RAC Newsletter, delivered via our RAC Email List Serve, continues to play a vital role in delivering updates – reaching over 750 businesses and individuals.

As our community continues to grow and diversify, so does the number of Newcomers accessing our services. RAC Alberton is pleased to support the work of our Community Navigator by partnering and promoting such sessions as Financial Literacy for Newcomers and The Hiring of Immigrant Workers.

RAC Alberton continues to host a full complement of Partners – Welcoming to our RAC Team: Jordan MacDonald – Executive Director, Develop West Prince, Genna Dumville – Program Officer, Skills PEI, Amanda Barlow – Interim NCCD Tourism Manager and Tracy Pineau – Project Coordinator, DWP.






Rural Action Centre -Stats At a Glance

Number of Clients by Activity



In October, 2022 CBDC Western PEI staff took part in a unique opportunity through Experience Lennox Island. They were guided in the hands-on process of making a moose hide drum of their very own. Instructor, Faith Matthews taught what the drum means to the Mi'kmaq culture, the history of the drum, and why it's important to share these teachings.

Following the workshop, staff took an informative tour of the Mi'kmaq Cultural Centre where they were shown a visual of the history and culture of the First Nations & Mi'kmaq people who settled in the area. Faith shared emotional words of residential school survivors and their families and the importance of talking about and creating awareness of the tragedies faced by families and communities.

The National Day of Truth and Reconciliation allows Canadians to honor the resilience and strength of residential school survivors and intergenerational survivors, as well as those children who tragically did not make it home. As an organization, we strive for continued reconciliation.
